

Frank was born in 1960 in Redbourn, Hertfordshire and his first interest in motorcycles stemmed from riding pillion on his cousin's Norton Commando Fastback - aged 14. His first motorcycle was a Yamaha DT125 and since then he has owned and ridden a range of Japanese and European motorcycles. His love of two-strokes, mainly from the 70s and 80s eras, has remained throughout. He is married to wife Stephanie and has two children.

A regular club and national level motorcycle road race competitor in the mid-eighties. In 1985 he turned to pure road racing competing in the Manx Grand Prix and then the TT where he competed almost every year until 1996. His swansong TT was in 2002 aboard the Honda SP1 he still owns. Other bikes currently in his stable include a Suzuki 500 Gamma and a Yamaha 350 YPVS.
